The Great Pyramid of Giza is the oldest, yet the only surviving of the Seven Ancient Wonders and the most famous pyramid in the world. It is presumed to have served as the tomb of the 4th dynasty Egyptian Pharaoh, Khufa (also known under his Greek name Cheops), after whom it is often called "Khufus Pyramid". It is the oldest and largest of the three great pyramids in the Giza necropolis on the outskirts of modern Cairo in Egypt. It took 100,000 men twenty years to complete building it. The great Pyramid is built entirely of limestone, and Close to 22 million blocks of limestone, each weighing approximately two tons, were used. It was originally 146 m high and the side of its square base was 250 m long

The site was first prepared, and blocks of stone were transported and placed . An outer casing (which disappeared over the years) was then used to smooth the surface. They were referred to as "The Granaries of Joseph and "The Mountaing of Pharaoh". The second pyramid, the tomb of King Chephren, appears to be the largest, but actually it was constructed on a plateau. The third Pyramid belonged to King Mycerinus. The Great Pyramid, together with the other pyramids and the Sphinx, form a part of the tourist region of the Giza Plateau There is also a museum housing the mysterious Sun Boat, only discovered in 1954 near the south side of the pyramid. The boat is believed to have been used to carry the body of Khufu in his last journey on earth before being buried inside the pyramid.

The ancient Egyptians built their tombs on the west side of the Nile River and their temples On the easSt. Inis practice corresponded to the rise and setting Cthe sun which

represented the cycle of life itself. The east signified rebirth and he west signified death. with the tombs on the west or left bank, the spirits dead would be ready to journey into the cycle of life. The Egyptians believe in the afterlife and made complete preparation for this journey.
